

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Indian School Psychology Association (InSPA)

InSPA is a voluntary non-profit psychological service society. The primary aim of the Association is (i) to develop School Psychology as a sub-discipline, to promote value-based education and training to meet the needs of society, (ii) to promote communication among professionals who are committed to the improvement of the mental health of children in Schools, and (iii) to establish Centers and promote high quality School Psychology programmes to meet the needs of specific groups, particularly children and teachers. InSPA is an affiliated association of the International School Psychology Association, USA and The Indian Academy of Applied Psychology, India.

InSPA took initiative to create awareness regarding the need for School Psychology training and services for the school teachers and children. With this mission, we have made a humble beginning by collaborating with like-minded teachers and psychologists who are trained in the field of educational, counselling and clinical psychology with a keen interest in School Psychology.

The first InSPA national conference was organized at Jai Narain Vyas University, Jodhpur from 26th to 28th November 2011, the 2nd national conference was held at Calicut University, Calicut in 2012, the 3rd national conference was organized at NIEPM, Chennai in 2013, the 4th international conference on School Psychology was held at Gauhati University, Guwahati, Assam in 2014, the 5th International conference was conducted at KBP College of Arts and Commerce, Mumbai in 2015, and the 6th InSPA International conference was held at Pondicherry University on 13th - 15th October, 2016. The 7th InSPA International conference was held at Mysore University on 09th - 11th November, 2017 and 8th InSPA International conference was held at Andhra University on 11th - 13th October, 2018. The 9th InSPA International Conference was held at Pandit Deendayal Petroleum University, Gandhinagar on 14 – 16 November 2019. 10th and 11th by virtual at Aligarh Muslim University and Madras University in 2020 and 2021. 12th was at Pondicherry University in 2022, 13th at University of Science and Technology Meghalaya in 2023, and 14th at Central University of Tamil Nadu, Thiruvarur in 2024. All these conferences consist of keynote speeches, concurrent scientific sessions, presentation of papers, symposia, workshops, poster sessions, exhibition of products made by the Special children, cultural programmes, social events, interactive sessions and children's assemblies.

All the accepted abstracts received on or before 30.06.2025 will be published and distributed to the delegates on the first day of the conference. Selected papers will be published in the form of a book and a separate notification will be sent to the concerned authors.

General Instructions

1. Conference presentation of paper will be confirmed subject to submission of full paper and power point (PPT) to inspaindia@gmail.com on or before 30.06.2025.
2. The oral presentation does not require the submission of full paper. However, PowerPoint presentations will be accepted.
3. Registered delegates are most welcome to display their posters at the conference venue.

4. All suitable full papers would be considered for publication by the InSPA journal/ book and the corresponding authors would be intimated about signed agreement for publication along with the review comments of the papers.
5. Every registered delegate will be permitted to present one paper at a time allotted during the conference and will get the certificate of presentation at the concerned session of the conference. Presentation of additional papers, if any by the same author(s), is permitted based on the payment of Rs.1000/- (per paper).
6. Participation certificate will be given for individual delegates. Title of the paper presentation certificate purely based on the book of abstracts. Each paper with the name(s) of the author(s) given on one certificate.
7. The accompanying delegate, if interested in participating in the conference has to pay accompanying delegate fee.
8. Participation in all the three days are mandatory. There is no provision for one or two-day participation.
9. Transportation facilities not arranged. Registered delegates requested to reach the accommodation venue on their own.
